



#### **Pedal Power!**



Greenwood's art students have had the opportunity to work with visiting artist Harriet Riddell this term. Students explored the theme "this is me" and used pedal powered sewing machines to create images. These ranged from fast cars to lizards and turtles!

The individual works have been brought together to be displayed at "the Arc" in Winchester at the same time as 2 incredible tapestries by the artist Grayson Perry. These depict the contemporary life of a fictional character, Julie Cope. Thousands of visitors will see our work over the coming weeks. We are planning a school visit for all of those that took part and in the mean time students can visit independently for free if they let Bianca know they will be going. The exhibition runs from 15th March until 12th June.

#### SoCo Music Project

Students who are interested in music making will have the opportunity to visit a professional music studio on the last day of term.

We will be spending time at SOCO's Planet Sounds music studio in Southampton and taking part in workshops that might include lyrical recording through singing and rapping using instruments, beat making and lyric writing.

We look forward to developing the skills of our budding musicians and giving them an exciting insight into the music industry.

Out side of school, SOCO currently offers free studio time at Planet Sounds to 13 to 18 year olds on Saturdays 12-2 and Wednesdays 4-6. Young people can use the facilities, work with musicians and performers and meet other young people with similar interests. # Many young people who are victims of cyberbullying suffer in silence.



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
