



Pupil Premium Impact Statement 2015 – 2016

The pupil premium was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years. This additional funding is given to schools so that they can support their disadvantaged pupils and close the attainment gap between them and their peers. The government has determined that it is for schools to decide how the pupil premium is spent, in order that they might make appropriate additional provision for individual students. Greenwood School draws this funding from referring schools.

In the academic year 2015 - 2016 Greenwood School had 34 students in receipt of Pupil Premium funding.

As a result of interventions and additional support offered to those students, the following outcomes were achieved:

Achievement - Pupil Premium pupils achieved 5.6 points less than non-Pupil Premium pupil; **2.8 sublevels lower**.

Progress - Pupil Premium pupils made on average 6.7 points of progress, compared to non-Pupil Premium who made 9.6 points of progress from the beginning of the year, this is a difference of **1.5 sublevels lower**.

KS3 Maths

Achievement - Pupil Premium pupils achieved 6.8 points less than non-Pupil Premium pupil; **3.4 sublevels lower**.

Progress - Pupil Premium pupils made on average 0 points of progress, compared to non-Pupil Premium who made 2.3 points of progress from the beginning of the year, this is a difference of **1.2 sublevels lower**.

Year 10 English

Non-Pupil Premium	5	2.6	2

Achievement - Pupil Premium pupils achieved 0.1 points higher than non-Pupil Premium pupil.

Progress - Pupil Premium pupils made on average 2.2 points of progress, compared to non-Pupil Premium who made 2 points of progress from the beginning of the year, this is a difference of 0.2 points higher.

Year 10 Maths

Achievement - Pupil Premium pupils achieved 0.2 points higher than non-Pupil Premium pupil.

Progress - Pupil Premium pupils made on average 0.3 point of progress, compared to non-Pupil Premium who made 1 point of progress from the beginning of the year, this is a difference of 0.7 points lower.

Year 11 English

Non-Pupil Premium	14	31.4	6

Achievement - Pupil Premium pupils achieved 14.2 points less than non-Pupil Premium pupil; 2.4 grades lower.

Progress - Pupil Premium pupils made on average 3 points of progress, compared to non-Pupil Premium who made 6 points of progress from the beginning of the year, this is a difference of 0.5 grades lower.

Year 11 Maths

Non-Pupil Premium	10	27	-5.8

Achievement - Pupil Premium pupils achieved 9.6 points lower than non-Pupil Premium pupil; 1.6 grades lower.

Progress - Pupil Premium pupils made on average -2.4 points of progress, compared to non-Pupil Premium who made -5.8 points of progress from the beginning of the year, this is a difference of 0.6 grades higher.
